
CUB SCOUT PROGRESSIVE SCHEME













Cub Scout Uniform (Girl)

Requirements for the Cub Scout Membership Badge Age 7-11 Years

The Cub Scout should know the following

01. Cub Scout Promise

Know the Cub Scout Promise

02. Cub Scout Law

Know the Cub Scout Law

03. Motto

Be able to say the motto

04. Smartness

Know how to stand at attention and at ease

05. Salute and Handshake

Know the Cub Scout Salute and the Left Handshake correctly.

06. Grand Yell

Know how to perform the grand yell.

07. Jungle Story

Know the story up to admission of Mowgli to the pack

08. Good Deed

Give a verbal report of a good deed done by the Cub Scout to the Akela.

09. Safe from Harm

Complete the requirements under the membership section as indicated in safe from harm table in the last page

10. Two months service after joining the Cub Pack

The Cub Scout Leader will certify that the Cub Scout has successfully completed this requirement and recommend the Cub Scout for the Membership Badge

BRONZE STAR AWARD



Requirements for the Bronze Star Age 7 Years & 2 months-11 Years

01. Collecting Money in a till

From the time the Cub Scouts receive their membership they should collect money in a till until they receive their Bronze Star.

02. Knowledge on different religions

Know the names, symbols, and the places of worship of the main four religions in Sri Lanka.

03. Happy Service

To perform a service with the pack to help others happily.

Eg: - Cleaning the classroom / Donating books to a library/

Making a flower bed.

04. Reef Knot

Know how to tie the reef knot and the uses of it.

05. Reading the time

Make a Clock and be able to read the time (minimum of four times)

06. Cleaning Shoes

Keep one's shoes clean (Polish them if possible)

07. Scarf

Learn how to fold and wear the scarf

08. Create a Simple Art or Handwork

Create a Simple Art or Handwork. (Can be held as an exhibition on a later date)

09. National Anthem

Recite the National Anthem and know the correct way of standing when it is sung.

10. Observation

Observe 3 different kinds of flowers and 3 different kinds of birds found in the Cub Scout's home/area and present a verbal report to the Akela.

11. Acting

Present either a performance of a story character or a mimicry of the movement of an animal.

E.g – How a rabbit hops, how Mahadana Mutta walks, a hawk flying fast.

12. Throwing and Catching a Ball

Participating in a game which involves catching and throwing a ball with other Cub Scouts.

13. Skipping

Skip forward 15 times and backwards 5 times using a standard skipping rope

14. Leap Frog

Perform the leap frog correctly with another Cub Scout suitable for his height.

15. Good Health Habits

Write down good health habits on a Bristol board & exhibit it in School while participating in a health procession/parade.

16. Details of Family

Should know his/her home address and telephone number and should present a verbal report to the Akela on details about them selves and about their family.

17. Road Safety

Know how to safely travel on a road and how to safely cross a road. Present information regarding road safety to the Akela verbally.

18. Serving Food

With the help of the Akela make and serve either sandwich, fruit salad or fruit kebabs as a "Six"

19. Scout Songs

Sing two scout songs with his "Six"

20. Commands

Practice the commands learnt up to now

- Standing at attention and at ease
- ii. Left turn
- iii. Right turn
- iv. About turn
- v. Dismiss

21. Jungle Story

Know the Jungle Story from when Mowgli entered the pack untill he was rescued by Kaa the python.

22. Safe from Harm

Complete the requirements under the Bronze Star section as indicated in safe from Harm table in the last page.

23. Six months service

Complete six months of service after completing the membership award.

01. Compulsory Proficiency Badge :

Either Book reader or Artist Badge

A Cub Scout can only win this star after the age of 7 years and 8 months and before they are 11 years old.

Other than the compulsory badge he can also attempt 4 proficiency badges from the following:

Musician / Entertainer / Collector / Cyclist / Athlete

The recommendation will be given by the Cub Scout Leader, that the Cub Scout has successfully completed all the requirements and has qualified for the Bronze Star.

SILVER STAR



Requirements for the Silver Star Age 8 Years and 2 months -11 Years

01. Savings Account

Deposit the money which was collected when completing the Bronze star in a savings account. (Open a savings account if he/she does not have one. The Cub Scout can attempt the Little saver badge as well while completing this requirement)

02. Religious Activity

Participate in a special programme relevant to his/her religion. E.g – Observing Sil on a Poya day, taking part in 'Novena' or other services in church, A pooja in a Hindu temple, Fasting during Ramazan.

03. Thriftiness and Good order

i. Clothes

At a pack meeting, wash either his/her school uniform or Scout uni form with soap and dry it.

ii. Books

The Cub Scout must learn how to properly use his/her books and bag.

iii. Either put a cover for a book or make a bookmark.

04. Stitching a button

Should be able to thread a needle and stitch a button with two holes onto a small piece of cloth.

05. Greeting

- To know the forms of greeting at different times.
 - E.g Good Morning / Good Night etc.
- All cubs should make a greeting card at a pack meeting.
 E.g. birthday card/ Vesak card/Christmas card/Eid Mubark

06. Respect

Should know how he/she should respect elders.

07. Sheet Bend

Should know how to tie the Sheet Bend correctly and know the uses of it.

08. Preparing Tea

Should make tea as a "Six" and present it properly.

09. Journey

Visit a significant place close to his/her school with his/her pack.

Present a report on the importance of that place to his/her

Akela.

E.g. - Police Station, Post office, Flower Garden

National Flag

Should know what the colours and symbols included in the National flag represent and should know to stand at attention when hoisting the National flag.

11. Observation (Trees and Mammals)

Observe 03 kinds of trees and 03 kinds of mammals and present a verbal report to his/her Akela.

12. Creativity

Make a creative object which is useful for day-to-day activities using natural materials or disposed items.

13. Folk Songs

Sing two folk songs with his/her pack.

14. Great Characters

Perform an act as a "Six" about a great character in history.

E.g – Madduma Bandara, Weerapuran Appu, Hon. D.S. Senanayake, Pandith Amaradeva, T.B. Jayah, Ponnambalam Ra manathan.

15. Obstacle Course

Participate in an Obstacle Course.

E.g. – Creeping through a tyre, creeping through an obstacle, creeping under a chair.

Smartness

Mark time and forward march

17. Acting to a song in a drama

Act while performing a song as a "Six"

18. Somersault/Cartwheel

Perform either a cartwheel or somersault twice.

19. Balancing

Walking a distance of about six meters balancing a weight on the head. (Use a book or a covered half brick, The Akela may decide on a suitable weight)

20. Foreign Scout Song or Yell

As a six or a pack, present a foreign Scout song and a yell.

21. Jungle Story

Should know the Jungle Story from when Kaa rescues Mowgli to the Red Flower being brought to the Seonnee Forest.

22. District or National Activity

Participation in a Cub Scout Day, District Cub Scout Rally or a Cub boree.

23. Safe from harm

Complete the requirements under the Silver star section as indicated in safe from harm table in the last page.

24. Six Months Service from completion of the Bronze Star

The Silver Star can only be won after the age of 8 years and 2 months and before the age of 11 years.

The House Orderly and Gardener Proficiency Badges are compulsory.

The Cub Scout can attempt 06 more Proficiency Badges other than the First Aider, Happy Home and Guide or international section proficiency badges.

The recommendation will be given by the Cub Scout Leader, that the Cub Scout has successfully completed all the requirements and has qualified for the Silver Star.

GOLD STAR



Requirements for the Gold Star Age 9 Years and 6 months – 11 Years

01. Cub Scout Prayer/ Reflection

Participate in a multi-religious programme organised by the Cub Scout Leader

02. Scrap Book

As shown by the Akela, press 10 varieties of leaves and flowers each and paste on a book and name them.

03. Happy Service

Engage in service in a significant place close to his/her school (For 01 hour)

E.g -A place of religious importance, a public place

04. Round Turn and Two Half hitches

Should know how to tie the Round turn and two half hitches correctly and know the uses of it.

05. Clove Hitch

Should know how to tie the Clove Hitch correctly and know the uses of it.

06. Cooking

Prepare either sweet potatoes, manioc, breadfruit, potatoes, chickpeas, or something similar and serve it. (If you choose to cook chickpeas use chickpeas which has been previously soaked in water).

07. Ironing clothes

Iron a pair of trousers or a frock during a pack meeting. (With adult supervision)

08. Sensory training games

Participate in three Sensory training games organised by the Akela.

09. Ramble or Treasure Hunt

Participate in a ramble or a treasure hunt with his / her "Six" organised by the Akela. (half a day)

Advertisement

Prepare a positive advertisement suitable for children and per form with his/her six.

11. Nature Picture

Draw a picture using the theme from nature

E.g – a tree, the beach, a mountain, a paddy field, a flower garden

12. Performing a Children's play

Perform a drama on a theme given by his/her Akela with his/her six.

Climbing a tree or a rope

Climb a tree or rope to a height of 02 meters.

14. First Aid

Prepare a First Aid box with six items.

Know the items necessary for treating a simple wound and know how to use them.

15. Work Study

With a friend, observe and study any two of the following places/institutes and present the work done by them to the Akela.

- A Public Library
- II. Museum
- III. Zoological Gardens
- IV. Supermarket
- V. A village market
- VI. A farm
- VII. A carpentry work shop
- VIII. A village smith's workshop
- IX. Post Office
- X. Harbour
- XI. Swimming Pool
- XII. A tea factory etc.

16. Red Flower

Actively participate in a 'Red Flower' programme organised by the Akela.

17. Yells

Perform three yells individually.

18. The Founder -B.P.

- Make Know the following facts about B.P.
- □ Country he was born in
- M His date of birth
- ☐ The country B.P passed away in

19. Cub Holiday Camp

Participate in a pack holiday camp with other Cub Scouts working on the Gold Star. (Stay one night)

20. Jungle Story

Should know the Jungle Story from the bringing of the Red flower to the Seonnee forest to the bringing of the skin of the tiger.

21. Safe from harm

Complete the requirements under the Gold Star section as indicated in safe from harm table in the last page..

22. Six months Service

Complete six months of service after completing the Silver Star. It is compulsory to win the three proficiency badges Happy Home, Guide and either the First Aider Badge or any one of the International badges.

The Gold Star can only be won after the age of 9 years and 6 months and before the age of 11 years.

Apart from the proficiency badges completed for the Gold Star, if the Cub Scout wishes he/she may complete another 8 more proficiency badges.

After winning the Gold Star, he / she may win the rest of the proficiency badges if desired. (before 11 years.)

He/She will be eligible for the Gold Star only after successfully being interviewed by the Assistant District commissioner (Cubs) of the District.

Cub Scouts do not use log books. They have to use the Activity books for each section, Membership, Bronze, Silver, and Gold Star designed by the Cub Scout Section of the National Programme Committee - SLSA.

Cub Scout Proficiency Badges


Proficiency badge syllabus can be obtained from the Scout Shop or download from the website (www.scout.lk) When attempting a desired proficiency badge, he must be knowledgeable of the badge requirement.

When meeting the badge examiner, the Cub Scout should follow the undermentioned

- 1. Be dressed in uniform
- Should have written the badge syllabus in the Activity book
- 3. Should have a good Knowledge about the badge syllbus
